The Original "GRANT Rocker"[™]

Folks, as I often hear the young ones say, "Man this rocker is radically awesome!" Although I will not sell this as a strict orthopedic chair, I will admit to receiving some fine compliments from the medical community concerning its high orthopedic value, both verbal and written. We have even had some people sit in this chair who were destined to go to the chiropractors and experience a spontaneous adjustment! Yes, awesome! Personally, I like the chair because it cants back further than most rocking chairs and it has a real nice sweep to the rocking motion. I like to call it a Rocking Rocker; its a lot of fun!

A professional engineer told my Dad, "I don't know where your son got the know how concerning the proper angles but there is absolutely nothing that could be done to improve this design," I graciously accept that compliment for the Lord Jesus Christ. This "Grant Rocker"[™] is destined to be an investment piece for your family.

The absolute highest compliment any buyer can give to the struggling craftsman is a repeat order. Go the extra mile; give a little extra; this is what generates customer loyalty and builds a solid reputation. When you can bring literal tears of joy to a customer because of the excellency of your craftsmanship, then you have built an heirloom. When a customer returns 17 years later and describes still how beautiful and how well the furniture you had built for them has held up through many moves and many children, then you have done justice to your professional craftsmanship. This is where the real quality of American manufacturing resides, with its craftsmen.

The heirloom pieces pictured here are designed to withstand the vagaries of time and abuse. You should never have to buy the craftsman produced piece but one time. All of these pieces are built with solid boards. No veneer, no cardboard, no stain, no bull! Just quality.

Most furniture built by production facilities are finished with a stain to "give it the same color tone." When the stain is applied it effectively kills the beautiful patina that walnut and cherry develop over a period of time. The patina is in reality a color tone change that develops as a result of natural light interacting with the natural chemicals in the wood. Stain is never used in our heirloom pieces. Because of this fact, all of the wood used in a particular piece must come out of the same log, thus the assurance of a beautiful, natural patina.

I have personally logged the trees themselves just to get the right color. The trees are dropped in winter, sawed into boards in spring, air dried a year for every inch of thickness and then kiln-dried. Each piece is personally designed and manufactured by the artist. More time is spent composing the lumber than most other facilities do building it.

Admittedly, creativity is present in varying degrees with everyone, therefore, I certainly encourage prospective clients to discuss their own ideas and designs. A simple pencil drawing with desired dimensions is sufficient.

Please compare the quality and value that you see here with the typical "store bought veneer furniture." As a customer, you either buy furnishings every five years from the retailers with all their exorbitant markups or you buy a beautiful one-of-a-kind heirloom one time to last a lifetime! We certainly believe the following pictures will convince you of the beauty and investment value of a "GRANT" heirloom. Remember, it is the bargain basement "deals" that always cost you money.

Quality you will buy one time; and that my friends, in the long run, will always save you money.
